<p><u>OPEN ELECTIVE COURSE (OEC)</u></p> <p><u>YOUTH, GENDER & IDENTITY</u></p>	<p>CO1: Despite the growing population of youth identifying with a transgender or no binary gender identity, research on gender-diverse individuals’ educational outcomes is limited.</p> <p>CO2: This study takes advantage of the first nationally representative, population-based data set that includes measures of gender identity and educational outcomes</p> <p>CO3: Using minority stress and structural symbolic interactionism frameworks, we examine the association between gender identity and high school and college educational outcomes</p> <p>CO4: We compare the educational outcomes of gender-diverse youth—binary transgender, no binary, and gender unsure—with those of cisgender youth, and also examine differences within the gender-diverse population.</p> <p>CO5: Given the strong link between minority stress and educational experiences among gender-diverse youth.</p> <p>CO6: Our framework and findings have implications for measuring and theorizing gender identity, raising questions about youth’s ability to express their gendered selves given cultural narratives of gender identity.</p>
