ಮರಾಠರ ಪ್ರಸಿದ್ಧ ಸಾಮ್ರಾಟ ಹಾಗೂ ಹಿಂದೂ ಸಾಮ್ರಾಜ್ಯದ ಸ್ಥಾಪಕ ಛತ್ರಪತಿ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯವರ ತಂದೆಯಾದ ಷಹಜೀ ಭೋಸಲೆಯವರು ಮರಾಠರ ವೈಭವಿಕತೆ ಇತಿಹಾಸಕ್ಕೆ ಬುನಾದಿ ಹಾಕಿದ ಮೂಲಪುರುಷ ಒಬ್ಬ ವೀರಯೋಧ, ಸಂಘಟನಾ ಚತುರ, ರಾಜಕೀಯ ನಿಪುಣರಾದ ಷಹಜೀ ಭೋಸಲೆಯವರು ಕ್ರಿ.ಶ 18ನೆಯ ಮಾರ್ಚ್ 1594 ರಲ್ಲಿ ಸತಾರ ಬಳಿ ವನಿತಾ ಗ್ರಾಮದಲ್ಲಿ ಜನಿಸಿದರು. ತಾಯಿ ಉಮಾಭಾಯಿ ( ದೀಪಿಕಾ ಬಾಯಿ), ತಂದೆ ಮಲ್ಲೋಜಿ , ಮೇವಾಡದ ಸಿಸೋಡಿ ಮನೆತನಕ್ಕೆ ಸೇರಿದವರಾಗಿದ್ದರು ಹಾಗೂ ಪ್ರಭಾವಿ ಮರಾಠ ನಾಯಕರಾಗಿದ್ದರು, ಷಹಜೀಯು ಪ್ರಾಪ್ತ ವಯಸ್ಕರಾದ ಮೇಲೆ ಜಿಜಾಬಾಯಿ ಹಾಗೂ ತುಕಾ ಬಾಯಿ ಮೋಹಿತ ಯವರ ಜೊತೆ ವಿವಾಹವಾಯಿತು. ಇಬ್ಬರು ಮಡದಿಯರಿಗೆ ಒಟ್ಟು ಮೂವರು ಮಕ್ಕಳು. ಜಿಜಾಬಾಯಿ ಯ ಮಗ ಶಿವಾಜಿ ಹಾಗೂ ತುಕಾ ಬಾಯಿ ಮೋಹಿತ ಅವರ ಮಗ ಏಕೋಜಿ ಹಾಗೂ ಸಾಂಭಾಜಿ.

ಕ್ರಿ. ಶ 1633 ರಲ್ಲಿ ಅಹಮದನಗರವು ಮೊಗಲರ ವಶವಾದಾಗ ಬಿಜಾಪುರವನ್ನು ಮೊಗಲರಿಂದ ರಕ್ಷಿಸಿ ಅನೇಕ ಸೈನಿಕ ಸಾಧನೆಗಳನ್ನು ಮಾಡಿದ ಕೀರ್ತಿ ಷಹಜೀ ಅವರಿಗೆ ಸಲ್ಲುತ್ತದೆ. ಕ್ರಿ.ಶ 1637 ರಿಂದ 1640 ರವರೆಗೆ ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಸೈನ್ಯದ ನಾಯಕತ್ವದೊಂದಿಗೆ ಕರ್ನಾಟಕದ ಅನೇಕ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳ ಮೇಲೆ ದಾಳಿ ಮಾಡಿ ಅವುಗಳನ್ನು ವಶಪಡಿಸಿಕೊಂಡರು. ಕ್ರಿ. ಶ 1637\_1638 ರಲ್ಲಿ ಬಿಜಾಪುರದ ಸುಲ್ತಾನನ ರಣದುಲ್ಲ ಖಾನ್ ಸಹಾಯದಿಂದ ಷಹಜೀ ಬೆಂಗಳೂರನ್ನು ವಶಪಡಿಸಿಕೊಂಡರು, ಅಲ್ಲದೇ ತಮಿಳುನಾಡಿನ ಕೆಲ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳ ಮೇಲೆ ದಾಳಿ ಮಾಡಿ ಕಂದಾಯ ವಸೂಲಿ ಮಾಡಿದರು. ಈತನ ಸೈನಿಕ ಸಾಧನೆಗಳನ್ನು ಗಮನಿಸಿದ ಬಿಜಾಪುರದ ಅದಿಲ್ ಷಾ ಬೆಂಗಳೂರು ಪ್ರದೇಶವನ್ನು ಜಹಂಗೀರರಾಗಿ ಹಾಗೂ ರಾಜೆ ಎಂಬ ಬಿರುದು ನೀಡಿದರು. ಅಲ್ಲಿನ ಆಡಳಿತ ನಿರ್ವಹಿಸುವಂತೆ ಸೂಚಿಸಿದರು. ದಕ್ಷಿಣ ಭಾರತದ ಪ್ರಮುಖ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳನ್ನು ಬೆಂಗಳೂರಿನಿಂದಲೇ ನಿಯಂತ್ರಿಸಲು ಪ್ರಾರಂಭಿಸಿದ ಷಹಜೀ ಬೆಂಗಳೂರನ್ನು ಆಡಳಿತದ ಕೇಂದ್ರವನ್ನಾಗಿ ಮಾಡಿಕೊಂಡರು ಅಲ್ಲಿ ವಾಸ್ತವ್ಯ ಯೋಗ್ಯವಾದ ಗೌರಿ ಮಹಲ್ ಎಂಬ ಅರಮನೆಯನ್ನು ಕಟ್ಟಿಸಿದರು. ಮಡದಿ ತುಕಾ ಬಾಯಿ ಮೋಹಿತ ಹಾಗೂ ಮಕ್ಕಳಾದ ಏಕೋಜಿ, ಸಾಂಭಾಜಿ ಜೊತೆ ಇಲ್ಲಿ ವಾಸ್ತವ್ಯವಿದ್ದರು. ಮರಾಠಿ ಭಾಷೆಯ ವ್ಯವಹಾರಗಳನ್ನು ಕರ್ನಾಟಕದಲ್ಲಿ ಆರಂಭಿಸಿದರು ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ತಂದೆಯ ಜೊತೆ ಬಾಲ್ಯದ ದಿನಗಳನ್ನು ಬೆಂಗಳೂರಿನ ಗೌರಿ ಮಹಲ್ ನಲ್ಲಿ ಕಳೆದರೂ ನಂತರ ತನ್ನ ತಾಯಿ ಜೀಜಾಬಾಯಿ ಜೊತೆ ಪುಣೆಯಲ್ಲಿ ವಾಸಿಸುತ್ತಾ ಅಲ್ಲಿ ತನ್ನ ರಾಜಕೀಯ ಕಾರ್ಯಕ್ಷೇತ್ರವನ್ನಾಗಿ ರೂಪಿಸಿಕೊಂಡರು.

ಷಹಜೀಯವರ ಆಡಳಿತ ಕಾರ್ಯದಕ್ಷತೆಯನ್ನು ಗಮನಿಸಿದ ಬಿಜಾಪುರದ ಅದಿಲ್ ಷಾ. ಬೆಂಗಳೂರಿನ ಜೊತೆ ಬಸವಪಟ್ಟಣ, ಚೆನ್ನಾಗಿರಿ, ಹೊಸಕೋಟೆ, ಕೋಲಾರ, ಚಿಕ್ಕಬಳ್ಳಾಪುರ, ದೊಡ್ಡಬಳ್ಳಾಪುರ, ಶಿರಾ, ತುರುವೇಕೆರೆ ಮುಂತಾದ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳನ್ನು ಷಹಜೀ ಅವರಿಗೆ ನೀಡಿದರು. ತುಕಾಬಾಯಿ ಮೋಹಿತನು ಮಕ್ಕಳಾದ ಏಕೋಜಿ ಮತ್ತು ಸಾಂಭಾಜಿ ಜೊತೆ ಬೆಂಗಳೂರಿನಲ್ಲಿ ವಾಸ್ತವ್ಯ ಹೊಂದಿದ್ದರು. ಆಂತರಿಕ ಸ್ವಾತಂತ್ರ್ಯ ಪಡೆದುಕೊಂಡು ಒಬ್ಬ ಸ್ವಾತಂತ್ರ್ಯ ಅರಸನಂತೆ ಆಳ್ವಿಕೆ ನಡೆಸಿದರು. ಮೈಸೂರು ಒಡೆಯರ ಜೊತೆ ಅನೇಕ ಯುದ್ಧಗಳನ್ನು ಮಾಡಿದರು ಆದರೆ ಯಾವುದೇ ಲಾಭ ದೊರೆಯಲಿಲ್ಲ. ಷಹಜೀ ಪ್ರಬಲ್ಯವೂ ಮೈಸೂರು ಒಡೆಯರ ನೆಮ್ಮದಿಗೆ ಭಂಗ ತಂದಿತು. ಕರ್ನಾಟಕದ ತನ್ನ ಅಧೀನದ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಮರಾಠರ ಮಾದರಿಯ ಕಂದಾಯ ಜಾರಿಗೆ ತಂದು ಮರಾಠಿ ಭಾಷೆಯನ್ನು ಆಡಳಿತ ಭಾಷೆಯನ್ನಾಗಿ ಜಾರಿ ತಂದರು ಅನೇಕ ಆಡಳಿತ ಭೂಕಂದಾಯ ಸುಧಾರಣೆಗಳನ್ನು ಜಾರಿಗೆ ತಂದರು ಸಾಂಭಾಜಿ ಮತ್ತು ಏಕೋಜಿ ಅವರಿಗೆ ಆಡಳಿತದಲ್ಲಿ ತರಬೇತಿಯನ್ನು ನೀಡಿದರು.

ಈ ಮಧ್ಯೆ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಪ್ರಾಪ್ತ ವಯಸ್ಸಿನಾದಾಗ ಮರಾಠ ರಾಜ್ಯ ಕಟ್ಟುವ ಕನಸು ಕಾಣುತ್ತಿದ್ದರು. ಪೂಣೆ ಸುತ್ತಮುತ್ತ ಪ್ರಾಬಲ್ಯ ಹೊಂದಿ ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳ ಮೇಲೆ ಸೈನಿಕ ಕಾರ್ಯಾಚರಣೆಗಳನ್ನು ಮಾಡಿದರು ಇದರಿಂದ ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಸುಲ್ತಾನನಿಗೆ ಷಹಜೀಯ ಮೇಲೆ ಅನುಮಾನ ಉಂಟಾಯಿತು ಅಲ್ಲದೆ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಈ ದಾಳಿಗೆ ತಂದೆಯಾದ ಷಹಜೀಯ ಸಹಾಯ ಇರಬಹುದು ಎಂದು ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಸುಲ್ತಾನನು ಯೋಚಿಸಿದನು. 1648 ರಲ್ಲಿ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಸಿಂಹಘಡವನ್ನು ವಶಪಡಿಸಿಕೊಂಡ ಮೇಲೆ ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಸುಲ್ತಾನನು ಷಹಜೀಯನ್ನು ಜುಲೈ 1648 ರಲ್ಲಿ ತಮಿಳುನಾಡಿನ ಜಿಂಜಿಯಲ್ಲಿ ಬಂಧಿಸಿ ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಜೈಲಿನಲ್ಲಿ ಹಾಕಲಾಯಿತು. ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಬಿಜಾಪುರಕ್ಕೆ ಸೇರಿದ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳನ್ನು ವಶಪಡಿಸಿಕೊಂಡ ಬಗ್ಗೆ ಷಹಜೀ ಪಾತ್ರವಿಲ್ಲ ಎಂಬುದು ಸುಲ್ತಾನನಿಗೆ ಮನವರಿಕೆಯಾದ ಮೇಲೆ ಷಹಜೀಯವರನ್ನು ಬಿಡುಗಡೆ ಮಾಡಲಾಯಿತು. ತಂದೆಯ ಬಿಡುಗಡೆಗಾಗಿ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಸಹ ವಶಪಡಿಸಿಕೊಂಡ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳನ್ನು ಹಿಂದಿರುಗಿಸಿ ತಟಸ್ಥನಾಗಿರಲು ಒಪ್ಪಿಕೊಂಡನು 10 ತಿಂಗಳ ನಂತರ ಷಹಜೀಯನ್ನು ಬಿಡುಗಡೆ ಮಾಡಲಾಯಿತು ಹಿಂದಿನ ಜವಾಬ್ದಾರಿಗಳನ್ನು ನೀಡಿ ಬೆಂಗಳೂರಿಗೆ ಕಳಿಸಲಾಯಿತು.

ಕ್ರಿ. ಶ 1651 ರಲ್ಲಿ ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಮತ್ತು ಗೋಲ್ಕಂಡಗಳ ನಡುವೆ ನಡೆದ ಯುದ್ಧದಲ್ಲಿ ಷಹಜೀಯು ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಸುಲ್ತಾನನ ಪರವಾಗಿ ಹೋರಾಟ ಮಾಡಿ ಬಿಜಾಪುರದ ಗೆಲುವಿಗೆ ಸಹಾಯ ಮಾಡಿದರು. ಕ್ರಿ. ಶ 1658 ರಲ್ಲಿ ಅದಿಲ್ ಷಾ ಮರಣ ಹೊಂದಿದ ಮೇಲೆ ಷಹಜೀ ಪ್ರಾಶ್ನ ತೀತ ನಾಯಕನಾಗಿ ಬೆಳೆದರು. ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಸ್ವಾಧೀನ ಹೊರಟಿದ್ದ ಹಿಂದ್ ಸಾಮ್ರಾಜ್ಯ ಸ್ಥಾಪನೆಗೆ ಸಹಾಯ ಯೋಜನೆ ಮತ್ತು ಮಾರ್ಗದರ್ಶನ ನೀಡಿದರು ಅಲ್ಲದೆ ಬಿಜಾಪುರ ಸುಲ್ತಾನನಿಗಿಂತ ಮೊಗಲರಿಂದ ನಮಗೆ ತೊಂದರೆ ಎಂಬುದನ್ನು ಶಿವಾಜಿಗೆ ಅರಿವು ಮೂಡಿಸಿದರು. ಷಹಜೀಯು ರಣದುಲ್ಲ ಖಾನ್ ಜೊತೆ ಸೇರಿ ಕರ್ನಾಟಕದ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳಾದ ಕೆಳದಿ, ಚನ್ನಪಟ್ಟಣ, ಶಿವಮೊಗ್ಗ, ಚೆನ್ನಾಗಿರಿ ವಶಪಡಿಸಿಕೊಂಡು ತನ್ನ ಅಧೀನ ತೆಗೆದುಕೊಂಡರು ಕಂದಾಯ ವಸೂಲಾಜಿ ಆರಂಭಿಸಿದರು.

ಇಷ್ಟೆಲ್ಲಾ ಸಾಧನೆ ಮಾಡಿದ ಷಹಜೀ ಅವರು ಬಹುಕಾಲ ಬದುಕುವ ಹಾಗೂ ಶಿವಾಜಿ ಕಟ್ಟಿದ ಮರಾಠ ಸಾಮ್ರಾಜ್ಯ ನೋಡುವ ಅದೃಷ್ಟವಿರಲಿಲ್ಲ ಕ್ರಿ. ಶ 1664 ಜನವರಿ 23 ರಂದು ಕಂದಾಯ ವಸೂಲಿ ಮಾಡುವ ಕಾರ್ಯದಲ್ಲಿ ಒಂದು ಸ್ಥಳದಿಂದ ಮತ್ತೊಂದು ಸ್ಥಳಕ್ಕೆ ಸಂಚರಿಸುತ್ತಿದ್ದರು. ಶಿವಮೊಗ್ಗ, ದಾವಣಗೆರೆ, ಚೆನ್ನಗಿರಿ ಪ್ರದೇಶಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಸಂಚರಿಸುವಾಗ ಇಂದಿನ ದಾವಣಗೆರೆ ಜಿಲ್ಲೆ, ಚೆನ್ನಗಿರಿ ತಾಲೂಕಿನ, ಹೊದ್ದಿಗೇರೆ ಸಮೀಪದಲ್ಲಿ ಸಂಚರಿಸುವಾಗ ಎರ ನೆಲದ ಬಿರುಕಿನಲ್ಲಿ ಇವರು ಸವಾರಿ ಮಾಡುತ್ತಿದ್ದ ಕುದುರೆಯ ಗೂರಸು ಸಿಕ್ಕಿಕೊಂಡು ಮುಗ್ಗರಿಸಿ ಬಿದ್ದಿದ್ದರಿಂದ ಷಹಜೀ ಅವರು ಸ್ಥಳದಲ್ಲೇ ಮರಣ ಹೊಂದರು. ತಂದೆಯವರ ಅಂತ್ಯ ಸಂಸ್ಕಾರವನ್ನು ಏಕೋಜಿಯವರು ಬಂದು ನೆರವೇರಿಸಿದರು ನಂತರದ ದಿನಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಭೇಟಿ ನೀಡಿ ಗೌರವ ಸಲ್ಲಿಸಿದರು. ಅವರ ಸಮಾಧಿಯನ್ನು ಹೊದ್ದಿಗೇರೆ ಗ್ರಾಮದಲ್ಲಿ ನೆರವೇರಿಸಲಾಯಿತು. ಅಲ್ಲಿನ ಅಂತ್ಯ ಸಂಸ್ಕಾರಕ್ಕೆ ತೋಡಿದ್ದ ಬಾವಿ ನೆನಪಿಗೆ ಕಟ್ಟಿಸಿದ ಮಹಾಲಕ್ಷ್ಮಿ ದೇವಿ ದೇವಾಲಯವನ್ನು ನಾವು ಇಂದಿಗೂ ಸಹ ಕಾಣಬಹುದು. ಷಹಜೀ ನಂತರ ಆತನ ಸಮಸ್ತ ಆಸ್ತಿಗೆ ಏಕೋಜಿ ಮತ್ತು ಸಾಂಭಾಜಿ ಒಡೆಯರಾದರು. ಇತ್ತ ಬಿಜಾಪುರದ ಪತನ ದೊಂದಿಗೆ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಪ್ರಬಲನಾದನು ಷಹಜೀ ಅವರ ಸೂಕ್ತ ಮಾರ್ಗದರ್ಶನದಲ್ಲಿ ಬೆಳೆದ ಶಿವಾಜಿಯು ಪ್ರಸಿದ್ಧ ಮರಾಠ ಸಾಮ್ರಾಜ್ಯ ಸ್ಥಾಪಿಸಿದರು ಅದರಿಂದ ಷಹಜೀ ಅವರು ಮರಾಠ ಸಾಮ್ರಾಜ್ಯದ ರಾಜ್ಯ ನಿರ್ಮಾಪಕರಾಗಿ ಅವರು ಮಾಡಿದ ಸಾಧನೆ ಅಮೋಘವಾದದ್ದು.

## **FLIGHT THROUGH TIME:** **TRACING THE PATH OF AVIATION EVOLUTION**

The urge of flying for humans had begun from 500B.C from the invention of kite and gliders to powered heavier than air flight. The dream of flight has captivated the human minds for century from the mythical wings of Icarus to the achievements of wright brothers. Over the past two centuries the aviation has evolved from a captivating idea to a global industry, transforming the way we travel, elaborating business and connecting the world. In this article we would look the wonderful journey of aviation highlighting the key milestones, innovations, and events that have shaped the industry to what's its today. From the first powered flights to modern era of supersonic travel and space exploration, examine the remarkable stories of how the humanity took the skies and never looked back.

The original idea behind the man-made flight originated in fabled stories in ancient Greece and ancient Persia from 347 BC. These stories spoke about the ancient legends of human flights that captivated the imagination of large audience. On looking these fable stories of ancient Greece and ancient Persia two stories where powerful for captivating the human imagination for flight. First of these stories where about the Greek myth of Icarus. In this story, the legend Icarus and his father where imprisoned on the top of a tallest tower in the kingdom of Crete. Using the feathers and wax Daedalus crafted two pairs of wings to escape. When they tried to fly, Icarus flew closer to the sun higher in the air, soon the wax in his wings started to melt and he fell to his death causing Daedalus to live his rest of his life in regret. The second myth was written in a poem Shahnameh according to this myth mythological Shaw Kay Kavos of great Iran had a craft which was carried by eagles. The myth says that Shaw Kay Kavos used this craft to travel to China. Later between the year 400BC and 300BC, ancient Greek mathematician Archytas of Tarentum created a steam powered wooden pigeon model. this wooden pigeon was launched projectile style into the sky and was a major breakthrough in replicating the art of flight. Later the times several winged flights attempts were made by Andalusian inventor Abbas Ibn Firnas and Eilmer Of Malmsbury. These attempts of flying didn't succeed but it had encouraged many other mathematician and physicians to study more and to gain interest in the area of air travel. Later in the year 1709 A Brazilian priest named Bartolomeu De Gusmao requested the king Jao.v of Portugal for his favour on constructing and airship called Pasarolla. Inspite this airship never flew, it created a huge impact on creating ideas for aircraft designers.

After a long attempts and designs created by many designers the first successful man-made air craft was created by the Montgolfier brothers Joseph-Michel Montgolfier. They invented the first pilot steered hot air ballon from a basic idea of observing laundry over a fire as the pockets bellowed upwards when the clothes dries. Joseph and his brother Jacques later built a similar contraption in a larger size. The Montgolfier tested their invention on 4th December 1782 and observed the lift off from the fire. the liftoff was so powerful and they ended up control over their new creation. Later the Montgolfier brothers created a giant globe shaped hot air ballon which was made of sackcloth's. this hot air ballon consisted of a dome and the lateral bands held together by 1800 buttons, they flew their hot air ballon on 4th July 1783 at Annonay, France in front of a crowd of people. This ballon had a flight time of approximately 10 minutes and cruised between an altitude of 1,600m and 2000m. The hot air ballon became exceptionally famous during the late 18<sup>th</sup> century which led to the discovery of relationship between altitude and atmosphere. However, the main downside of hot air ballons was a lack of agility. Jacques was the first human to travel in Ballon, followed by chemist Jean Francois Pilatre De Rozier and army officer Marquis d Arlandes conducted the first free flight by humans, travelling 3,000 feet above the city of Paris. Anne-jean Robert and Nicholas-louis Robert built the world's first hydrogen ballon with French professor Jacques Charles. He convinced that hydrogen would be an ideal power source due to its chemical properties' innovation of hydrogen balloon was a success.

The innovation of airship came to solve the issue with the Hot Air Ballons. While both are forms of lighter than air aircrafts, the airship also knowns as dirigible, improved upon the hot air ballons in several ways. One of the key figures behind the invention of airship was Ferdinand Von Zeppelin, a German count and aviation pioneer. Zeppelin's work in the late 19th and early 20th centuries led to the creation of the Zeppelin airship, which incorporated a rigid frame and advanced propulsion system, allowing for controlled flight. Zeppelins vision and dedication to aeronautical innovation played a crucial role in the evolution of airship

Alberto Santos Dumont was a Brazilian aviation pioneer who made significant contributions to the development of aviation. He is known for designing, building, and flying practical dirigible balloons and airplanes. Aircraft became militarized as soon it was invented. Italy was the first country to employ aircraft for military operations. Aircrafts were first used active combat on large scale in World War 1. It played a crucial role in the first world war. The military used fighter bombers, strategic bombers, dive bombers and ground-attack aircraft.

The radar invention led to the more precise, coordinated and controlled deployment. the revolutionary aircraft, the Douglas DC-3, a reliable all metal passenger airplane with rubberized seats to reduce vibrations and noise declining plastic insulations were used to make the flying more comfortable. Since its inception, aviation has profoundly transformed the society, the economy and the global connectivity. The invention of aviation revolutionized the way people and goods move around the world, leading to a multitude of changes across various aspects of life. In society, aviation has made distant places more accessible, fostering cultural exchange and enabling people to connect across borders more easily. Economically, aviation has become a vital industry, supporting millions of jobs worldwide and driving economic growth through tourism, trade, and transportation. Moreover, aviation has enhanced global connectivity by shrinking distances and facilitating rapid movement of people and goods, thus fostering closer ties between nations and embling faster communication on a global scale. In essence, aviation has not only changed the way we travel but has also played a pivotal role in shaping the interconnected world we live in today.

Modern aviation consists of wide range of achievements that has changed the industry in the recent years. From developing more fuel-efficient aircraft and integration of advanced technologies like GPS and auto pilot auto pilot systems. The modern aircrafts are equipped with digital systems, the cathode ray displays where changed to electronic displays. Today the commercial aviation relies on passenger jets such as Boeing 737, Airbus 320, Boeing 777, Boeing 787, airbus 380, Boeing 747 for long haul flights. The cargo airlines use Boeing 747 and the airbus 330 to transport goods to various places. In the military sector F-22 Raptor, F-35 lighting are used for combat missions and for transportation of goods and rescue operations C-17 Globemaster are used. These diverse aircraft types highlight the technological advancements and specialized capabilities preset in the modern aviation industry.

## **DEPRESSION**

Depressive disorder, commonly known as depression, is a prevalent mental health condition. Although it is widespread, it remains a serious disorder that negatively impacts mood and one's outlook on life, often accompanied by persistent feelings of sadness and a loss of interest. Depression affects how individuals think, behave, and perform even the most basic daily activities.

Depression can occur at any stage of life, but it typically begins during late adolescence to the mid-20s. According to surveys conducted by the World Health Organization (WHO), an estimated 3.8% of the global population experiences depression, including 5% of adults (4% among men and 6% among women) and 5.7% of adults aged over 60 years.

Symptoms of depression can include angry outbursts over minor issues, sleep disturbances, changes in appetite (either reduced or increased cravings for food), and frequent or recurrent thoughts of death. Depression extends beyond the typical ups and downs of daily life; the persistent sadness interferes with everyday activities and responsibilities. It not only affects emotions but also influences appearance and lifestyle.

There are several types of depression, including Major Depressive Disorder and Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD), which typically occurs during winter months, and Premenstrual Dysphoric Disorder (PMDD), often experienced by women one to two weeks before menstruation. Other forms include Psychotic Depression and Postpartum Depression.

The causes of depression can vary widely, encompassing factors such as failure, loss of a loved one, family issues, miscarriage, financial difficulties, illness, loneliness, or even menopause. While depression is common among both men and women, studies indicate that women are affected more frequently, with rates approximately 50% higher than those of men. Surveys worldwide show that over 10% of pregnant women and new mothers experience depression.

According to the WHO, more than 700,000 people die by suicide each year. It is not uncommon for individuals with mental health disorders, including depression, to experience suicidal thoughts. Researchers have observed that the rate of suicide among teenagers and young adults due to depression has been increasing over the past twenty-five years. Suicide is the fourth leading cause of death among individuals aged 15 to 29, often linked to depression and perceived by many as a viable solution to their suffering.

Despite its seriousness, depression is treatable. Seeking professional help or confiding in a trusted person can make a significant difference in managing the condition.



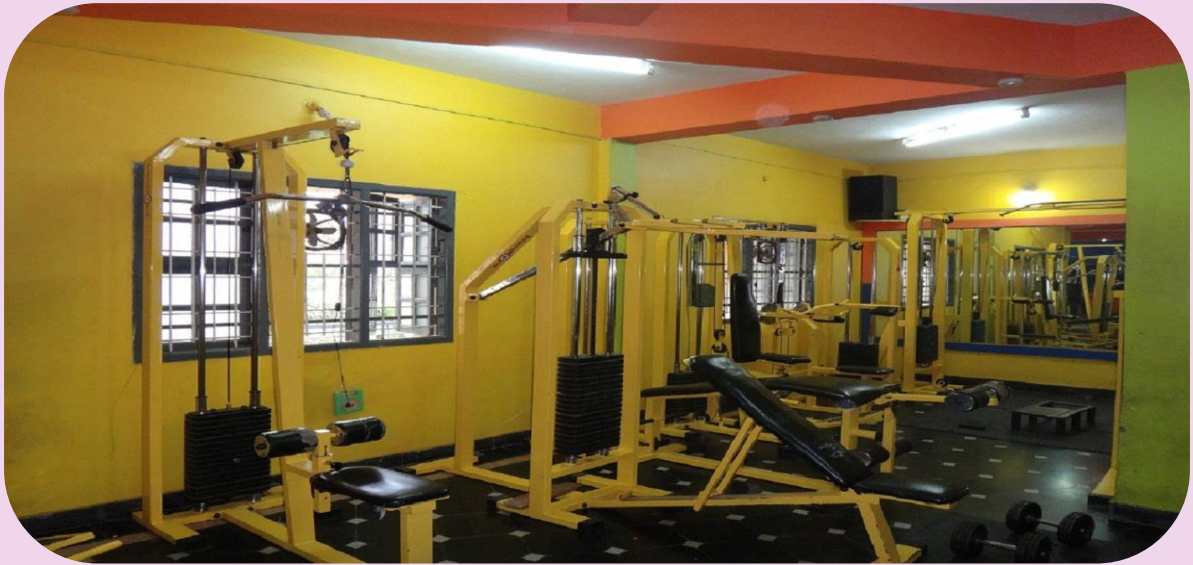

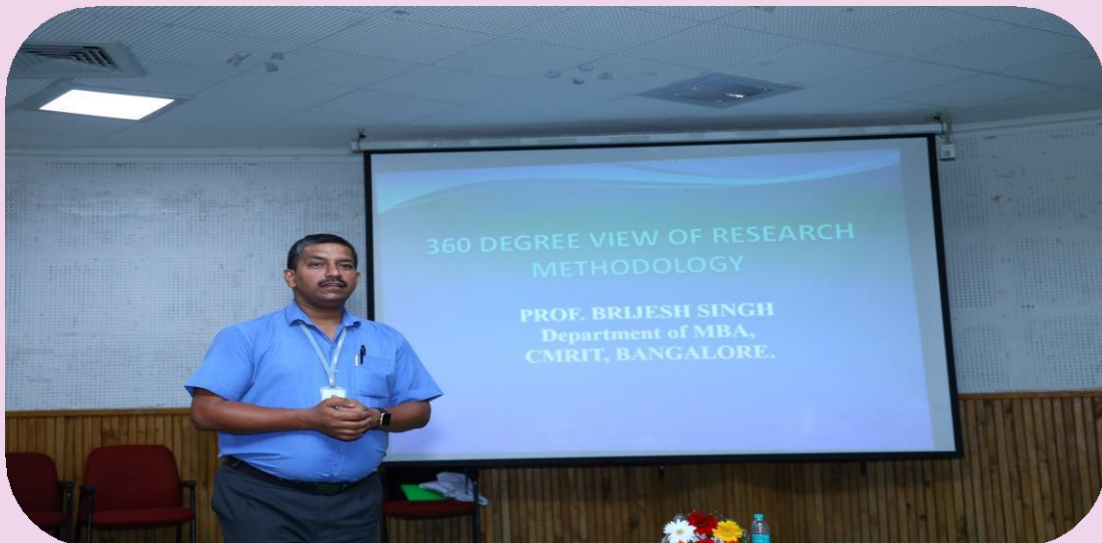
