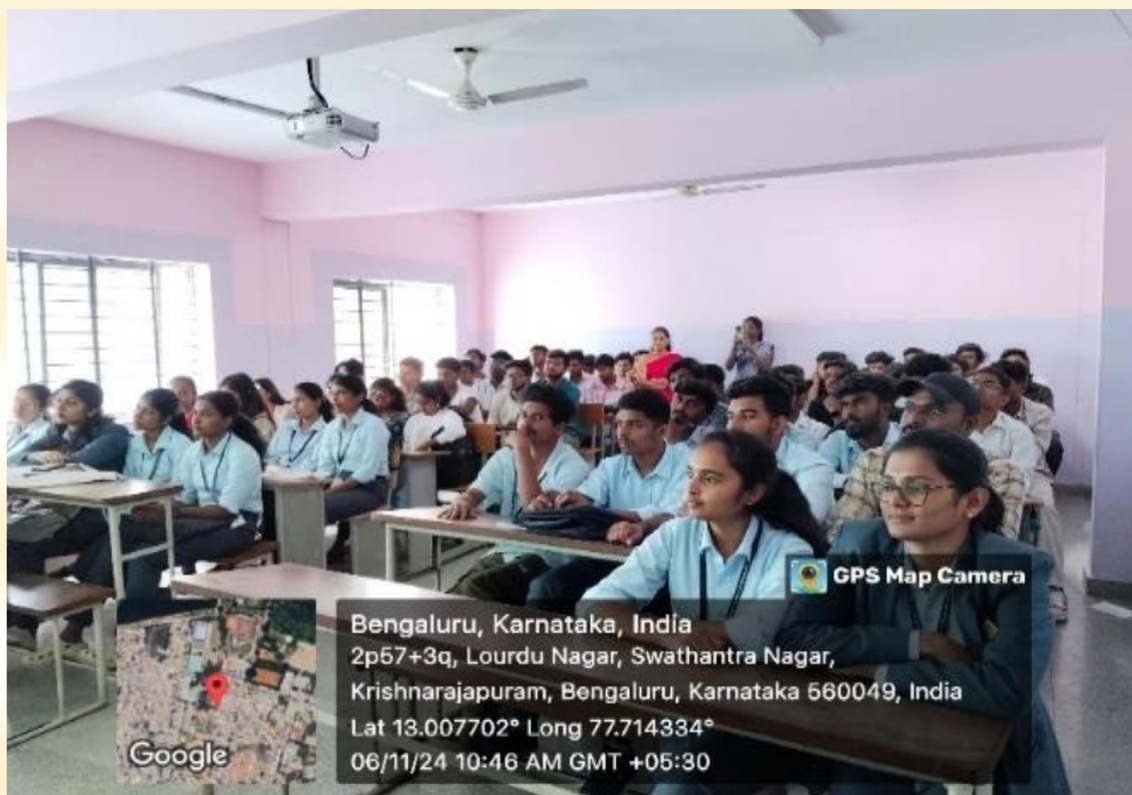
The program was a meaningful initiative, highlighting the significance of legal awareness in achieving social justice and empowerment.

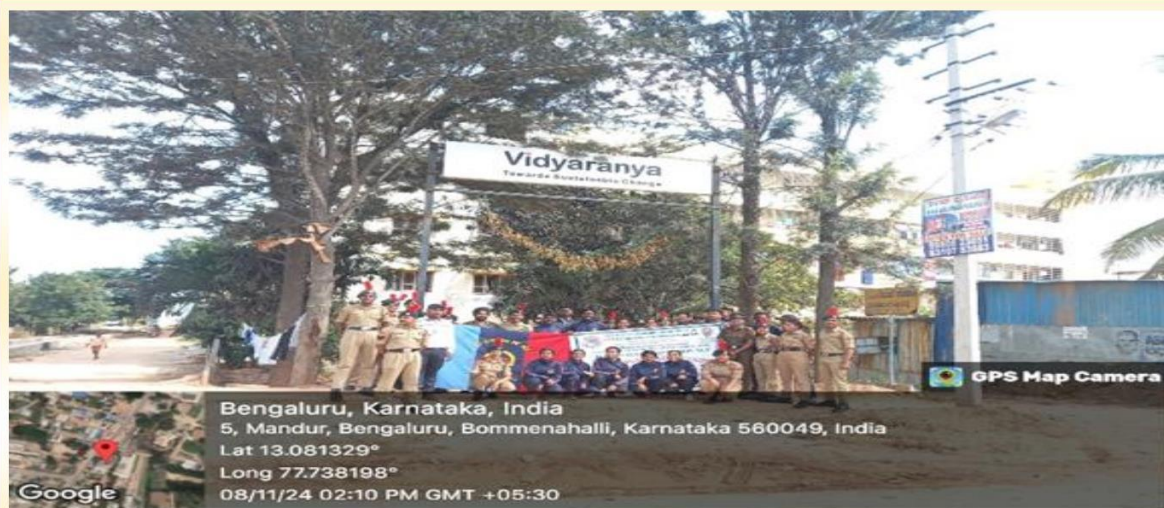

### **PRIDE AND PRIZES FOR THE STUDENTS OF S.E.A COLLEGE AT GARDEN CITY UNIVERSITY**

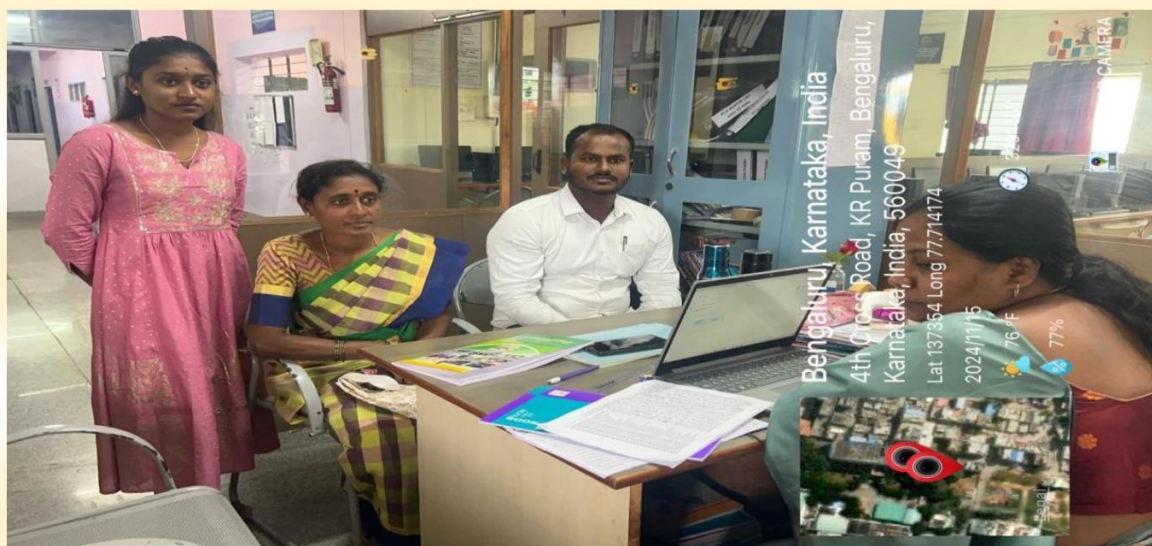

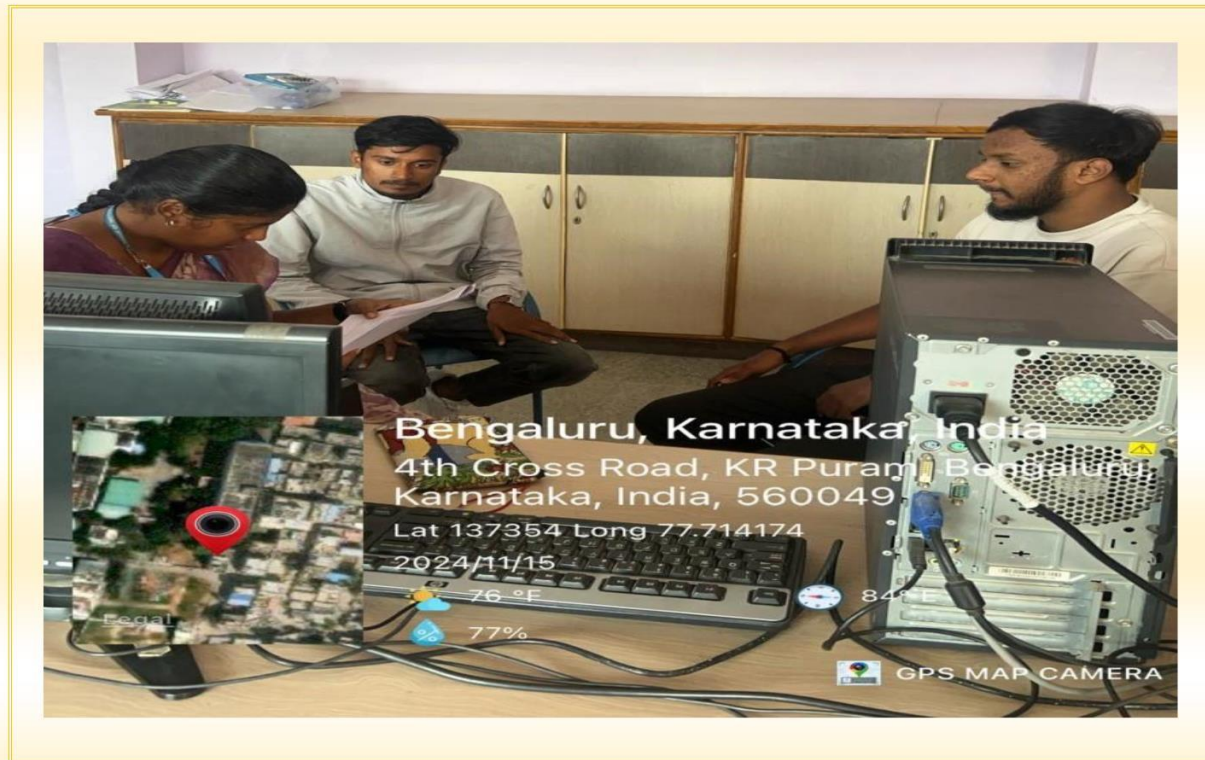

The event was a resounding success, reaffirming S.E.A Group of Institutions' commitment to advancing excellence in education.





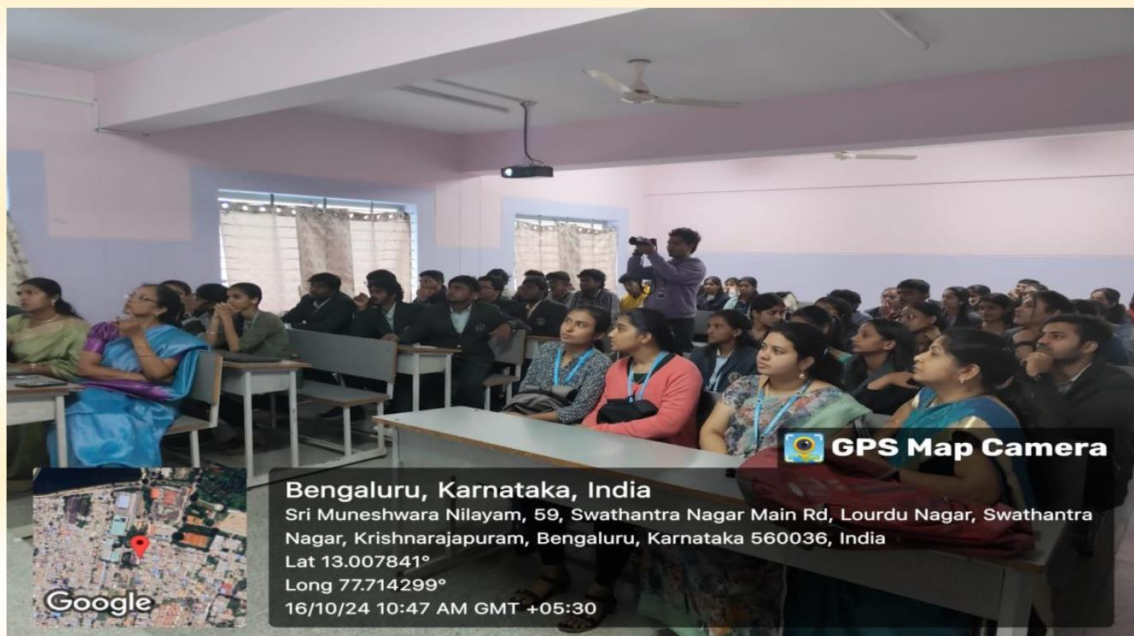
### **“INTERNATIONAL ACCOUNTING DAY”**
