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## INVITED LECTURE

### TOPIC: DIGITAL REVOLUTION IN PHYSICS – MS. MEGHA H. R. RESOURCE PERSON AT ST. ANN'S COLLEGE, HALASURU




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


### DISABILITY AWARENESS PROGRAM
