FACILITIES

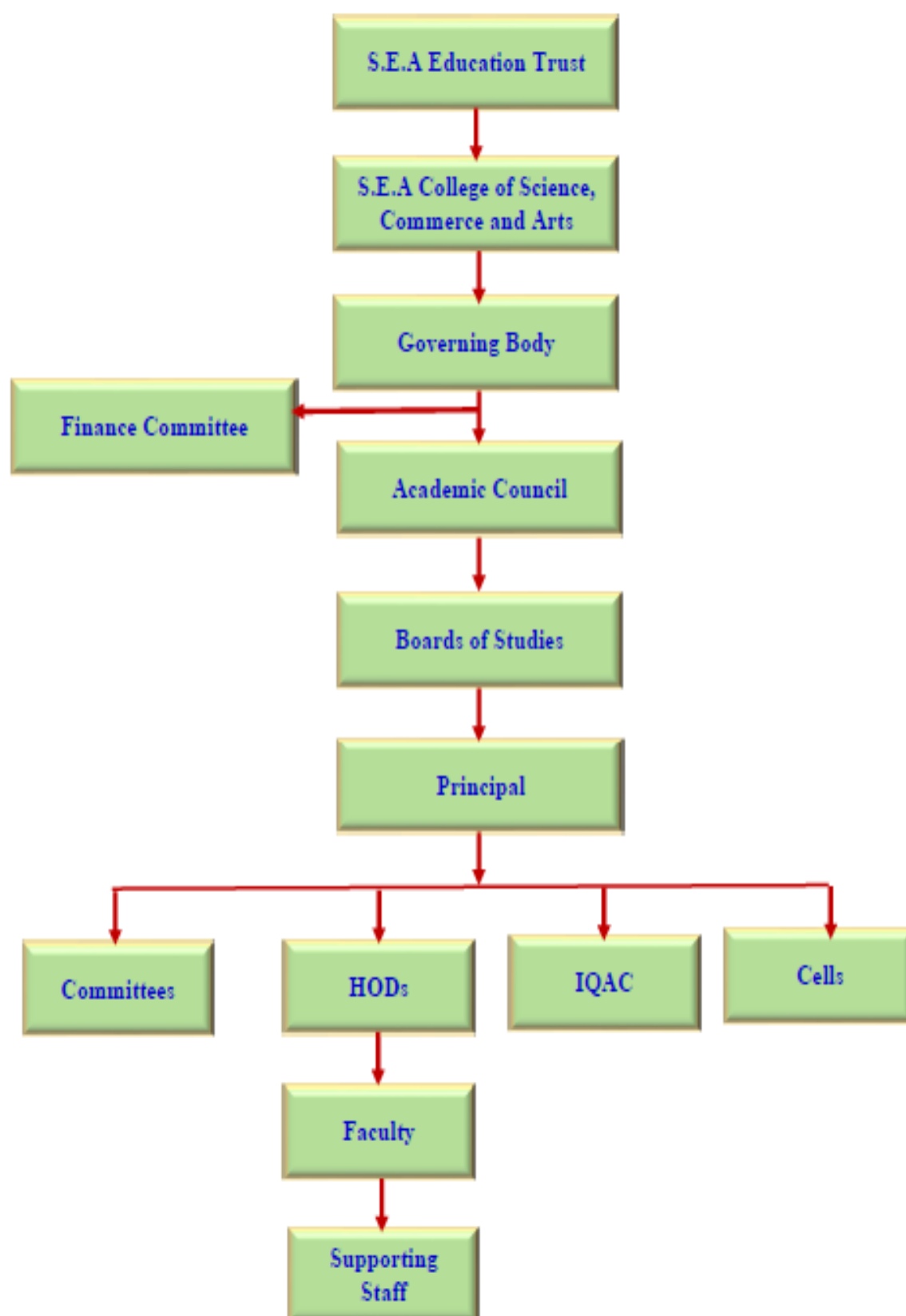

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

All students must abide by the rules and regulations of the College. The College authorities take disciplinary action if any student violates the rules and regulations. Students are required to adhere to the code of conduct and discharge their responsibilities as a student. Students are required to follow the following rules:

1. Classes start from 8.30 A.M. and may continue up to 3:30 P.M. Students are required to come to the College by 8.20 a.m. To attend the classes.
2. Every student must carry his or her identity card inside the campus. Any violation of this will lead to disciplinary action.
3. Students must help to keep the College campus neat and clean.
4. Students should wear College uniform from Monday to Friday and whenever instructed by the competent authority.
5. Use of mobile phones during class hours is strictly prohibited. Any violation of this will lead to disciplinary action. After two warnings, the mobile phone will be impounded and will not be returned.
6. Students need to read notices/circulars regularly.
7. Spitting, smoking, and throwing bits of paper on the premises are prohibited.
8. SEA Campus is plastic free. No student should use or throw plastic bottles/carry bags, etc.
9. Misuse or unauthorized use of the institute premises, items, or property, including computer misuse, library misuse, etc., may lead to disciplinary and/or penalized action.
10. Students should not involve in any ragging activities. Any violation of this will lead to penal action as per the guidelines of the supreme court & any other competent authority from time to time.
11. All acts of violence and sexual harassment of any kind will lead to disciplinary action and/or penal action as per the competent authority.

PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATION OF CODE OF CONDUCT:

The competent authority will impose any of the following punishments on any student if found guilty of any acts of indiscipline or misconduct and violation of the code of conduct of the college.

1. Debarring from appearing in university examination.
2. Deduction of internal marks.
3. Expulsion from the college and hostel.
4. Withholding results.
5. Ragging, in Institution, is considered a criminal offense and is punishable by law. Punishments can range from fines and imprisonment to more severe consequences depending on the severity of the act.
6. Lodging complaint with the Police.

5. Every faculty member should report to the College at least 10 minutes before the commencement of College.

7. All faculty members should prepare a lesson/teaching plan, notes, academic file well in advance before the commencement of the classes.
8. A mentor should take proper care of his/her group of students by guiding, motivating, counselling, and monitoring their attendance and performance.
9. Every faculty member should be responsible for conducting regular classes and practical and taking extra classes whenever necessary.
10. Every faculty member shall respect the rights and dignity of the student in expressing his/her opinion.
11. Every faculty member shall deal impartially with students regardless of their religion, caste, economic, social, and physical identity.
12. No faculty members shall act in any manner that violates the decorum or morality within the campus.
13. Every faculty member should work within the institutional policies and practices to satisfy the vision and mission of the institute/trust.
14. All faculty members must refrain from harassment or unlawful discrimination based on existing legislative norms relating to Gender/ Sexuality/Marital Status.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE AND ANTI RAGGING SQUAD

Rules And Guidelines

Anti-Ragging guidelines UGC regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009. (under section 26 (1)(g) of the University grants commission act,1956)

Preamble

In view of the directions of the Hon'ble supreme court in the matter of "University of Kerala v/s. Council, principals, Colleges and others" in Slp. no. 24295 of 2006 dated 16.05.2007 and that dated 8.05.2009 in civil appeal number 887 of 2009, and in consideration of the determination of the central government and the University grants commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or indiscipline

activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student, in all higher education institutions in the country, and thereby, to provide for the healthy development, physically and psychologically, of all students, the University grants commission, in consultation with the councils, brings forth this regulation.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (g) of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the University grants commission act, 1956, the University grants commission here by makes the following regulations, namely.

1. Title, Commencement, and Applicability

- These regulations shall be called the “UGC regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009”.
- They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official gazette.

They shall apply to all the institutions coming within the definition of a University under subsection(f) of section(2) of the University grants commission act,1956, and to all institutions deemed to be a University under section 3 of the University grants commission act, 1956, to all other higher educational institutions, or elements of such universities or institutions, including its departments, constituent units, and all the premises, whether being academic, residential, playgrounds, canteen, or other such premises of such universities, deemed universities and higher educational institutions, whether located within the campus or outside, and to all means of transportation of students, whether public or private, accessed by students for the pursuit of studies in such universities, deemed universities and higher educational institutions.

2. Objectives

To prohibit any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other students, or indulging in rowdyism or in-discipline activities by any student or students which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student; and thereby, to eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities, deemed universities and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these regulations, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided for in these regulations and the appropriate law in force.

3. What constitutes ragging

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts, or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.

- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homo sexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm, or any other danger to health or person.
- g. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- h. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority, or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

4. Every institution shall constitute the following bodies namely

- a. Every institution shall constitute a committee to be known as the anti-ragging committee to be nominated and headed by the head of the institution, and consisting of representatives of civil and police administration, local media, non-government organizations involved in youth activities, representatives of faculty members, representatives of parents, representatives of students belonging to the freshers' category as well as senior students, non-teaching staff; and shall have a diverse mix of membership in terms of levels as well as gender. It shall be the duty of the anti-ragging committee to ensure compliance with the provisions of these regulations as well as the provisions of any law for the time being in force concerning ragging; and, to monitor and oversee the performance of the anti-ragging squad in prevention of ragging.
- b. The institution every institution shall also constitute a smaller body to be known as the anti-ragging squad to be nominated by the head of the institution with such representation as may be considered necessary for maintaining vigil, oversight, and patrolling functions and shall remain mobile, alert, and active always.
- c. Provided that the anti-ragging squad shall have representation of various members of the campus community and shall have no outside representation.
- d. It shall be the duty of the anti-ragging squad to be called upon to make surprise raids on hostels, and other places vulnerable to incidents of, and having the potential of, ragging, and shall be empowered to inspect such places.
- e. It shall also be the duty of the anti-ragging squad to conduct an on-the-spot inquiry into any incident of ragging referred to it by the head of the institution or any member of the faculty or any member of the staff or any student or any parent or guardian or any employee of a service provider or by any other person, as the case may be; and the inquiry report along with recommendations shall be submitted to the anti- ragging committee for action under clause (a) of regulation.
- f. Provided that the anti-ragging squad shall conduct such inquiry observing a fair and transparent procedure and the principles of natural justice and after giving adequate opportunity to the student or students accused of ragging and other witnesses to place before it the facts, documents, and views concerning the incident of ragging, and considering such other relevant information as may be required.
- g. Every institution shall, at the end of each academic year, to promote the objectives of these regulations, constitute a mentoring cell consisting of students volunteering to be mentors for freshers, in the succeeding academic year; and there shall be as many levels as possible or tiers of mentors as the number of batches in the institution, at the rate of one mentor for six freshers and one mentor of a higher level for six mentors of the lower level.
- h. Every University shall constitute a body to be known as monitoring cell on ragging, Which shall coordinate with the affiliated Colleges and institutions under the domain of the University to achieve the objectives of these regulations; and the monitoring cell shall call for reports from the heads of institutions regarding the activities of the anti- ragging committees, anti - ragging squads, and the mentoring cells at the institutions, and it shall also keep itself abreast of the decisions of the district level anti- ragging committee headed by the district magistrate.

- i. The monitoring cell shall also review the efforts made by institutions to publicize anti- ragging measures, soliciting of affidavits from parents/guardians and students, each academic year, to abstain from ragging activities or willingness to be penalized for violations; and shall function as the prime mover for initiating action on the part of the appropriate authorities of the University for amending the statutes or ordinances or bye-laws to facilitate the implementation of anti-ragging measures at the level of the institution.

On receipt of the recommendation of the anti-ragging squad or receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the head of the institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the anti-ragging committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a first information report(fir), within twenty-four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- a. Abetment to ragging.
- b. Criminal conspiracy to rag.
- c. Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging.
- d. Public nuisance created during ragging.
- e. Violation of decency and morals through ragging.
- f. Body injury, causing hurt or grievous hurt.
- g. Wrongful restraint.
- h. Wrongful confinement.
- i. Use of criminal force.
- j. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences.
- k. Extortion; xii. Criminal trespass.
- l. Offences against the property.
- m. Criminal intimidation. Attempts to commit any or all the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s).
- n. Threat to commit any or all the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s).
- o. Physical or psychological humiliation.
- p. Allot her offences follow the definition of “ragging.”

6. Administrative action in the event of ragging

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here under:

- a. The anti-ragging committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, regarding punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the anti-ragging squad.
- b. The anti-ragging committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the anti-ragging squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely.
 - Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - With holding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
 - Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation processes with holding results.
 - Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national, or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - Cancellation of admission.
 - Rustication from the institution for periods ranging from one to four semesters.
 - Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

- c. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- d. An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie,
 - In case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University , to the vice-chancellor of the University .
 - In case of an order of a University , to its chancellor.
 - In case of an institution of national importance created by an act of parliament, to the chairman or chancellor of the institution.

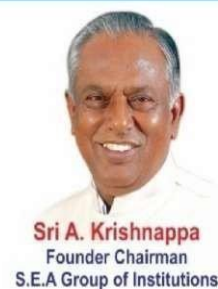

In order to improve upon the Discipline and Maintenance of the Hostel administration, all the inmates of the Hostel are hereby directed to adhere to the following Rules without fail.

1. Maintain the Timings of the Hostel Strictly. Inmates are not allowed to Enter/Exit the hostel after 6.00 PM
2. Students are not permitted to order any food items for consumption within the rooms. They will be checked every day while entering Hostel at entry Gates.
3. Students are not permitted to cook inside the room. If found, penalty will be imposed.
4. Students are not allowed to consume alcoholic, narcotic drugs or any intoxicating substances in the Hostel premises.
5. Students are instructed to keep their rooms neat & tidy and any materials are found not belonging to them, the same should be brought to the notice of the Warden immediately for clearance.
6. Students are instructed to advise the parents to inform their visit to the Warden in advance and enter their details in the visitors book.
7. Students are instructed not to permit any Guest into their rooms. In case parents want to stay any night in the hostel, permission should be obtained from the Warden.
8. Students are responsible for the safe keeping of their valuables. Students should provide their own lock and key and should take proper care of their belongings.
9. Students are also instructed to bring to the notice of the Warden any problems regarding non-functioning of the equipments or any other problems relating to the water or electricity.
10. Any illness or accident happening to any inmates should be brought to the notice of the Warden immediately.
11. Students indulging in the use of any abusive or threatening language, Physical Fight, use of force to get unfair act accomplished, etc will be punished. Further, they are liable to be expelled from the hostel/Institution.
12. Playing music/record player, loud speakers etc. causing disturbance to the neighbors is prohibited & will be punished.
13. No students shall be absent from the hostel without the permission of the Principal / Warden.
14. Not to stay in the hostel, while classes are going on as per the time table. In case of sickness, students are required to inform and take permission from the Principal.
15. Ragging in any manner is totally banned in the hostel/Campus. This is punishable as criminal offence, as per Supreme Court order.

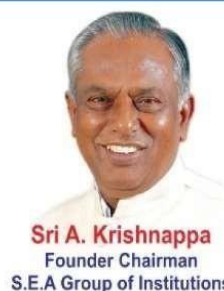

CIRCULAR

Sub: Rules and Regulation relating to Maintenance of Girls Hostel-Reg



In order to improve upon the discipline and Maintenance of the Hostel administration, All the inmates of the Hostel are hereby directed to adhere to the following Rules without fail.

1. Maintain the Timings of the Hostel Strictly. Inmates are not allowed to Enter/Exit the hostel after 6.00 PM
2. Students are not permitted to order any food items for consumption within the rooms. They will be checked every day while entering Hostel at entry Gates.
3. Students are not permitted to cook within the room. If found penalty will be imposed.
4. Students are not allowed to consume alcoholic, narcotic drugs or any intoxicating substances in the Hostel premises.
5. Students are instructed to keep the room neatly and any materials not belonging to them are found, the same to be informed to warden immediately for clearance.
6. Students are instructed to advise the parents to inform their visit to the warden in advance and enter their details in the visiting book.
7. Students are instructed not to permit any guest into their rooms. In case parents want to stay any night in the hostel, permission should be obtained from the warden.
8. Students are responsible for the safe keeping of their valuables. Students should provide their own lock and key and should take proper care of their belongings.
9. Students are also instructed to bring to the notice to the warden if any problems and non-functioning of the equipments or any other problems relating to the water or electricity.
10. Any illness or accident happening to any inmates should be brought to the notice of the warden immediately.
11. Students indulging in the use of any abusive or threatening language, Physical Fight, use of force to get unfair act accomplished, etc will be punished. Further, they are liable to be expelled from the hostel/Institution.
12. Playing music/record player etc. loud speakers enlarged to cause disturbance to her/his neighbor is prohibited. It will be punished. Repeated acts will render cancellation of allotment of hostel room.
13. No students shall be absent from the hostel without the permission of the Principal/warden.
14. Hostel Warden has the right to cancel the hostel rooms without primary notice of any student, who is involved in indiscipline activities.
15. Not to stay in the hostel, while classes are going on as per the time table. In case of sickness, students are required to inform and take permission.
16. Ragging in any manner is totally banned in the hostel/Campus. This is punishable as criminal offence, as per Supreme Court order.
