**ONE WEEK RURAL CAMP WITH UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN
(04-06-2025 to 11-06-2025)**

The Department of Social Work at S.E.A College of Science, Commerce, and Arts organized a week-long **Rural Camp** from **5th to 10th June 2025** at **Guttahalli Village**, in collaboration with the **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)** – a flagship initiative of the Government of India aimed at fostering rural development through academic engagement. The camp was thoughtfully designed to integrate research-based PRA (Participatory Rural Appraisal) activities, community interaction, data collection, awareness programs, and cultural engagement. Over the course of five days, students actively engaged with the local community to understand the socio-economic and environmental dynamics of the village. The camp began with an orientation and village transect walk to map resources, understand settlement patterns, and build rapport with residents. On Day 4, **Mr. Sathish D.V.**, an expert in internet management, conducted a session on digital literacy, helping students and villagers understand the importance of internet access and responsible online practices. On Day 5, **Mr. Magesh Babu H.G.**, Child Development Program Officer from Chintamani, delivered an insightful session on **Women and Child Development Schemes**, enlightening participants about government welfare programs and the role of ICDS in community well-being.

Further enriching the camp's agenda, **Dr. Major Narendra** from **Narayana Eye Hospital** conducted a **free eye camp**, offering check-ups and raising awareness about eye care. Complementing this, **Mr. Venkataramanappa**, Lecturer from the Government Pre-University College, delivered a talk on **Education and Environmental Awareness**, urging students and villagers to embrace education as a tool for empowerment and environmental stewardship.

Each day included PRA tools like social mapping, resource mapping, and focused group discussions, enabling students to conduct participatory research and develop community profiles. Evenings were marked by **cultural programs**,

fostering unity and showcasing local traditions. The camp successfully blended academic learning with field practice, providing students with experiential exposure while contributing meaningfully to the host community.
