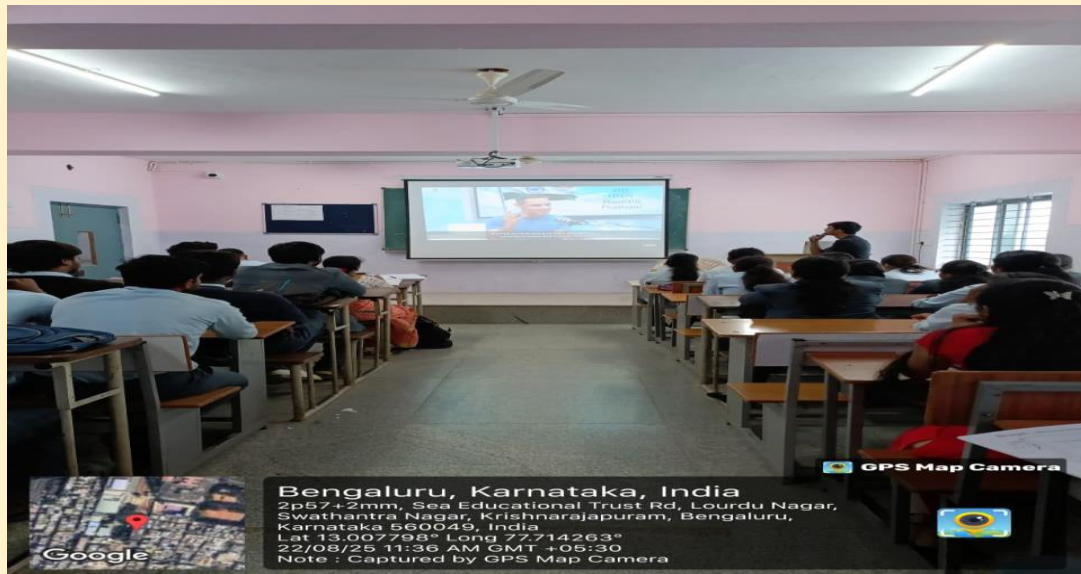


RASHTRA PRATHAM: IGNITING INNOVATION AND NATIONAL PRIDE

celebrated technical excellence but also encouraged students to explore web development as a creative and collaborative discipline.

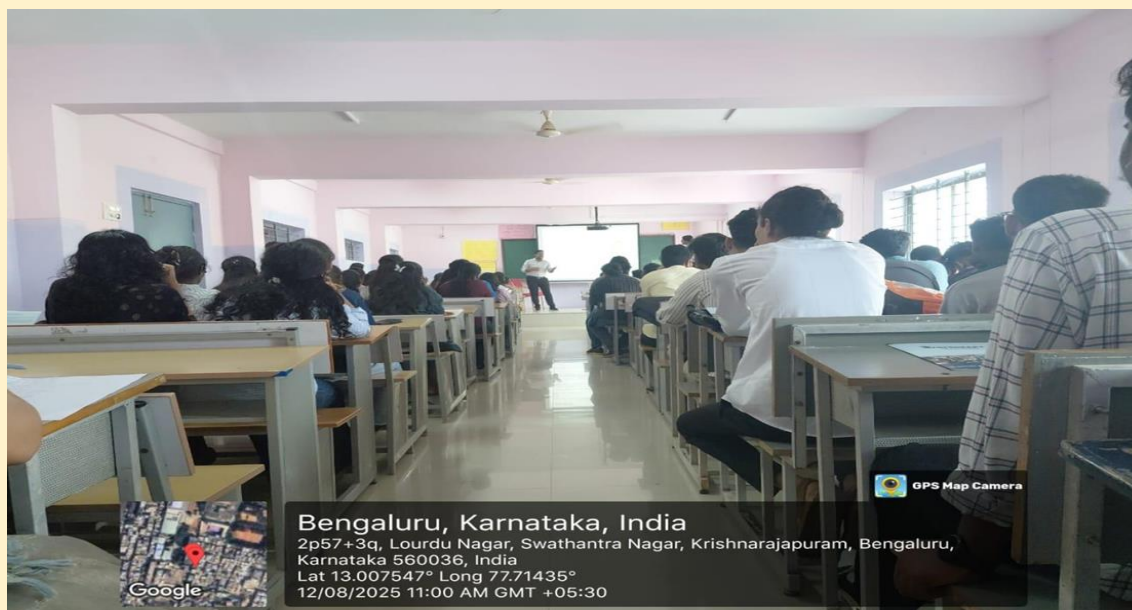


UPSC ORIENTATION

community extends its warm congratulations to Ms. Shalini B for this well-deserved honour.

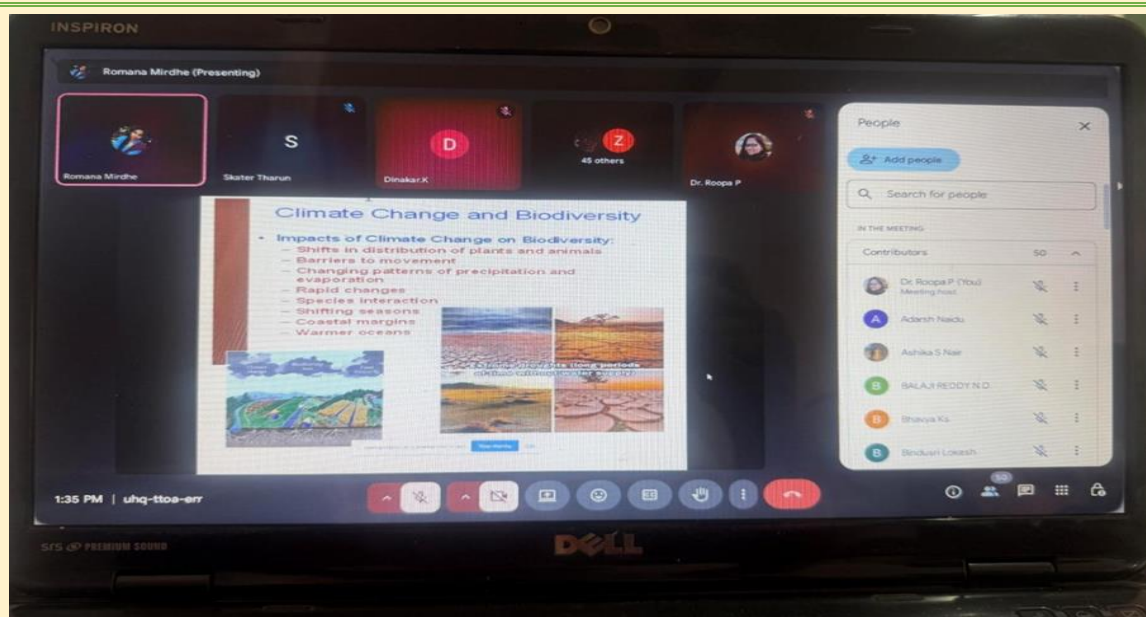


WEBINAR ON BIODIVERSITY AND ITS CONSERVATION
