The visit began at the **Pasteur Institute of India**, **Coonoor**, where students gained firsthand insight into vaccine production, public health initiatives, and the legacy of biomedical research in India. Engaging interactions with scientists and technicians offered a deeper understanding of the institute's pivotal role in immunization and disease prevention.

Next, the group explored the **Botanical Garden in Ooty**, a living repository of rare and indigenous plant species. The garden served as a natural classroom,
