

vision, resilience, and the value of learning through failure. His insights on strategic thinking and real-world execution offered students a practical lens into entrepreneurship.



Waste segregation, composting, and responsible e-waste disposal practices were observed and encouraged. 

Though his life ended at just 25, his influence continues to inspire movements for tribal rights and social justice across India. The workshop provided students with a deeper understanding of India's diverse freedom struggle, highlighting contributions that often receive less attention in mainstream historical narratives.


RALLY CHAMPIONS WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT AND ZERO TOLERANCE FOR VIOLENCE
