SAVITRI BHAI PHULE JAYANTI

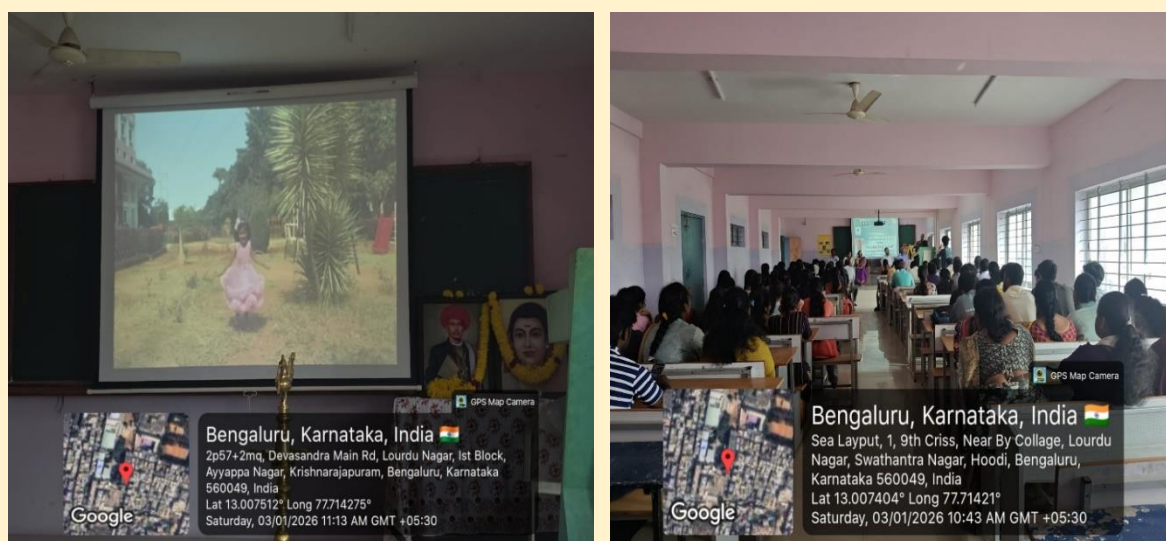
The **Women Empowerment Cell** celebrated **Savitribai Phule Jayanti** on **January 3rd, 2026**, marking both the birth anniversary of India's first female teacher and the institution's 25th year of championing women's empowerment. The event, centered on the theme "Dignity, Equality, and Safety of Women," reflecting the pioneering reformer's lifelong commitment to education and social justice. Dr. K. Viyyanna Rao, Former Vice Chancellor of Acharya Nagarjuna University and Honorary Director of S.E.A Group of Institutions, graced the occasion as Chief Guest, sharing valuable insights on the continuing relevance of Savitribai Phule's work in contemporary higher education. Mrs. Hemavati M, Vice Principal and Chairperson of the Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee, delivered the inaugural address, emphasizing the college's ongoing efforts to create safe and equitable learning spaces for all students. Dr. Nethra H.S, COE and Chairperson of the Women Empowerment Cell, presented a special address outlining the cell's initiatives and its vision for future engagement. Dr. Muthe Gowda T.N, Principal of the college, offered the presidential address, connecting Savitribai Phule 19th century struggles against social oppression with the institution's modern mandate to foster inclusive excellence. The celebration drew enthusiastic participation from faculty, students, and staff, all coming together to honor a woman who defied tremendous odds to establish the first school for girls in Pune in 1848. The event served as a powerful reminder that the values Savitribai Phule fought for—access to education, gender equality, and human dignity—that remain as vital today as they were over 175 years ago. Through a thoughtful short film, discussion and collective reflection, the college community reaffirmed its commitment to carrying forward her legacy of empowerment and social transformation.



SCREENING OF THE STORY OF SURAKSHA

The Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee presented a compelling short film titled "The Story of Suraksha" as part of the Savitribai Phule Jayanti celebrations on **January 3rd, 2026**, bringing to light the urgent realities of sexual harassment that many young women continue to face. The film followed the journey of Suraksha, a young girl whose life is upended by experiences of sexual harassment, offering an unflinching portrayal of the psychological toll such incidents exact on survivors. Through Suraksha's story, the audience witnessed the isolation, fear, and self-doubt that often accompany harassment, while also exploring the mechanisms through which she finds her voice and reclaims her sense of safety and dignity. The screening proved particularly effective in demonstrating that sexual harassment is not merely an uncomfortable incident but a violation that can profoundly affect a woman's mental health, academic performance, and overall wellbeing. What made the film especially resonant was its emphasis on safeguarding measures and the importance of institutional support systems in helping survivors navigate their recovery and seek justice. Mrs. Hemavati M, Chairperson of the Anti-Sexual

Harassment Committee, facilitated a thoughtful discussion following the screening, encouraging students to recognize warning signs, understand their rights, and utilize the college's reporting mechanisms without fear of stigma or retaliation. The film's message aligned powerfully with the day's overarching theme of "Dignity, Equality, and Safety of Women," reinforcing that creating safe educational spaces requires both awareness and active intervention from the entire college community. Students responded with visible engagement, many expressing that the film helped them articulate experiences they had previously struggled to name or address. By choosing to screen this film on Savitribai Phule Jayanti, the committee drew a meaningful connection between historical struggles for women's dignity and contemporary battles against sexual harassment, reminding everyone that the fight for women's safety and equality remains ongoing and requires collective vigilance.

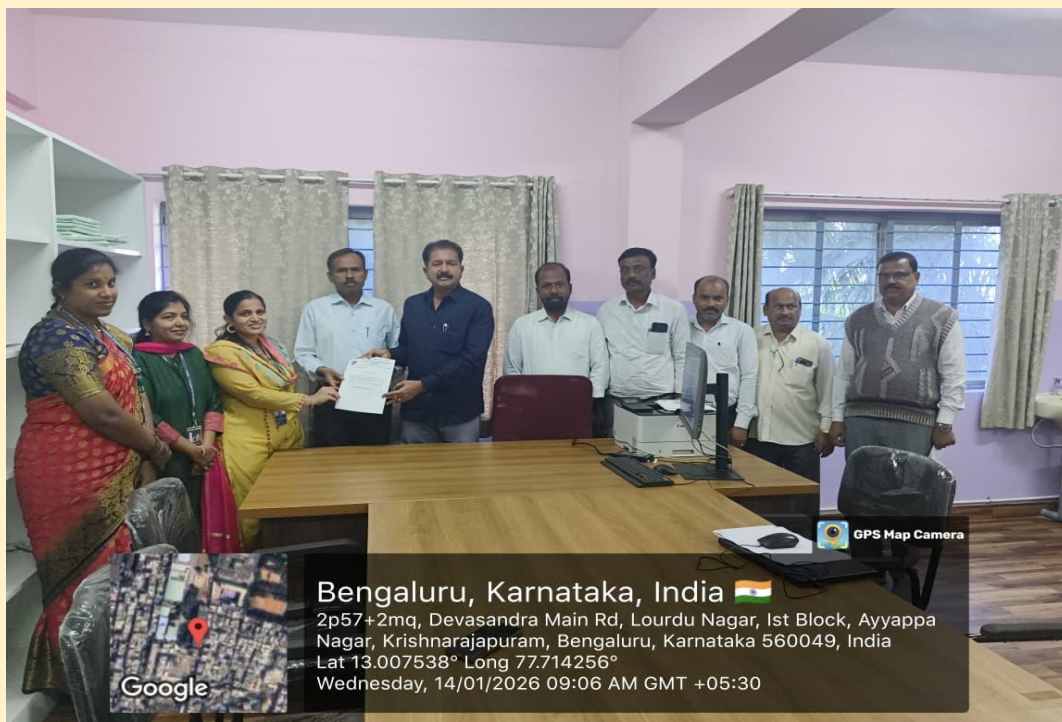
concluded with a short felicitation ceremony, appreciating the winners and contributors. It was a memorable morning of learning, laughter, and lively tech spirit.
